



## Provider Eligibility

To be eligible for participation in the Primary Care Practitioner Loan Redemption Program of New Jersey (NJLRP), provider applicants:

- Must have completed graduate training/residency program under the following disciplines and primary care specialties:

- Must be a resident of New Jersey.
- Must be a U.S. citizen or U.S. national if the loan redemption is funded by matching dollars from federal/state funds.
- Must maintain a current license to practice in the State of New Jersey.
- Must agree to practice primary care on a [full-time basis](#) for a minimum of two years at an NJLRP approved site.
- Must have outstanding medical/dental/graduate school [qualifying educational loans](#).
- Must be free of judgments or defaults on qualifying educational loans.
- Cannot simultaneously participate in the federally administered [U.S. Department of Health & Human Services National Health Service Corps](#) while participating in the NJLRP.
