New Jersey Survivor Tuition Benefits Program & Law Enforcement Officer Memorial Scholarship



Survivor Tuition Benefits Program (STB) is eligible children and surviving spouses of New Jersey firefighters, emergency service workers and law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty to earn a bachelor's degree.

Eligibility

Students must:

- Be a child or surviving spouse of a New Jersey firefighter, emergency service worker or law enforcement officer killed in the line of duty
- Students must be citizens, eligible non-citizens or eligible to file the NJ Alternative Financial Aid Application
- Be enrolled at least half-time in an undergraduate program at an approved New Jersey college, university or degree-granting proprietary school
- Be registered with Selective Service (if required)
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress
- Eligibility is limited to eight years from the date of the child's high school graduation and eight years from the date of death for the spouse.
- Not have received the maximum number of payments

Benefits

The STB award provides students with free tuition at any public institution of higher education in New Jersey.

Award also pays for enrollment at participating independent institutions in the New Jersey State. A list of approved institutions can be viewed on this brochure.

The award amount cannot exceed the highest tuition charged at a New Jersey public institution.

Awards are renewable. Scholarships depend on available funding.

Law Enforcement Officer Memorial Scholarship (LEOM)
The Law Enforcement Officer Memorial (LEOM) Scholarship benefits dependent children of New Jersey law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty.

Eligibility

Students must:

- Be a dependent child of a New Jersey law enforcement officer killed in the line of duty
- Students must be citizens, eligible non-citizens or eligible to file the NJ Alternative Financial Aid Application.
- Be enrolled full-time in an undergraduate degree program at an approved New Jersey college, university or degree-granting proprietary school
- Be registered with Selective Service (if required)
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress
- Students who have received the maximum number of payments are not eligible.

Benefits

The LEOM scholarship covers up to the cost of attendance, less other scholarships, grants, benefits and other assistance awarded under HESAA statute. Awards are renewable for up to four years.
